JACoW “Movers”

- Steering Committee
 - SPC Chairs (past, current and future) of each conference series - one meeting per year during IPACs - attendance “if possible”
- Team
 - Conference editors (past, current and future for each series) - one meeting towards the end of each year - attendance is a boundary condition for publication on the JACoW site
 - Some conferences forget this



Team Meetings

- Regular attendance at Team Meetings is essential to maintain high standards. The result is
 - enhanced cooperation and collaboration across the whole accelerator field
 - the development of the SPMS and associated Profile/Affiliation Repositories (20,000 individual profiles, 3000 affiliations)
 - Mailing Lists
 - Organization of events, including scientific programme, delegate/exhibition registration, accommodation, refereeing
 - experience and competence in professional electronic publication techniques
 - swift publication on JACoW with JPSP scripts

The Website

Since 1996

- 100 sets of proceedings published
- >500,000 downloads of papers per year



TM 2009 at DESY

- 2009 Team Meeting at DESY
 - 42 participants (maximum that could be accommodated) from all continents
 - Lots of discussion and new developments ...
 - Featured a tutorial on SPMS with first draft of Users Manual at the new website created by Stefano Deiuri

TM Decisions/Actions

- Christine was confirmed as Deputy Chair
- Acrobat 9 and PitStop 9 have been purchased (financial contributions from IPAC'10, EPS-AG, IPAC'12). The software needs to be tested, and new instructions drafted



TM Decisions/Actions

- SPMS
 - Matt continues to debug and develop
 - Organize a technical workshop on SPMS to review in particular
 - all “current” functionality
 - new functionality developed for Presentations Manager and Transparency Processing - done and used here for the first time
 - extending functionality to include budget/project management
 - documentation (see below)
 - Ronny to explore CERN’s willingness to get a separate instance of Oracle for JACoW which is Unicode aware – no progress
- Explore setting up of InDiCo Regional Support Centres for JACoW Events
 - OK with CERN, FNAL and KEK
 - (Still) Requires a “Cookbook” for JACoW Editors (JPSP compatibility)
 - More thought required to see whether JACoW Repository could be included ...
