Motivation

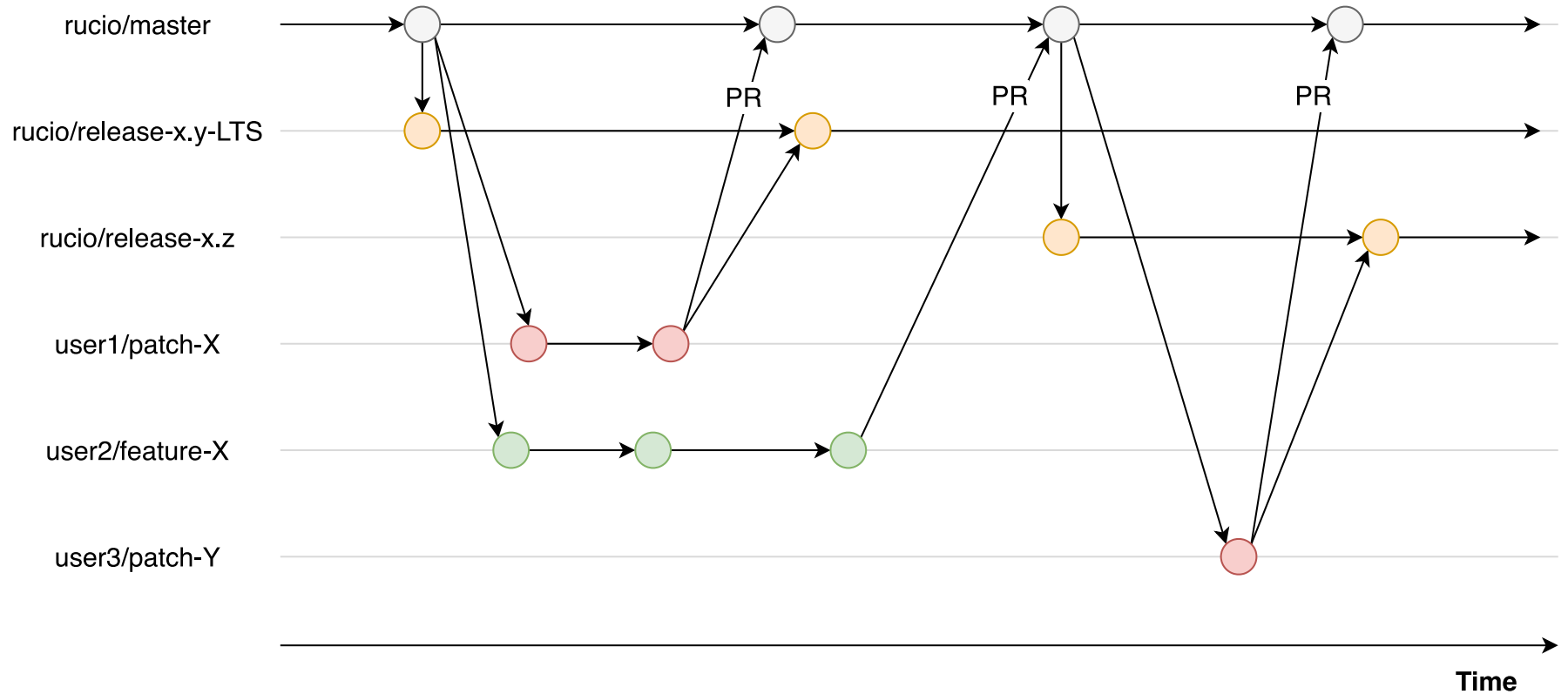
The current code management model with two PRs against `next` and `master` is very cumbersome. This should be changed to a model with only one PR necessary.

The Idea

- Getting rid of the next branch
- Using master as the main development branch
 - All pull requests should be created against master
- Not moving away from using feature and patch branches
- Release branches for the currently supported releases
 - Necessary patches will be cherry-picked to the release
- Automated testing of PRs against the latest release branch












GitHub Actions

- Concurrency: 20 jobs vs. 5 jobs on Travis
- Flexibility: events like labeling an issue or a timer can trigger a workflow
- Shell, Python, Docker are ready-to-use
- Bigger steps can be outsourced to custom actions
- Contrary to Travis, its infrastructure is not Open Source
- A workflow step may trigger some other CI via webhook

- ▶  **Set up job** 2s
- ▶  **Grab latest release branch** 1s
 - ⊘ **Fail if no release branch was found** 0s
- ▶  **Run actions/checkout@v2** 3s
- ▶  **Fetch pull request commit range** 0s
- ▶  **Run ../github/actions/mergetest-docker-action** 21s
- ▶  **Fetch containers repository and fetch or build images** 5m 14s
- ▶  **Run docker-compose-storage-build composition** 1m 11s
- ▶  **Run tests with docker** 7m 33s
- ▶  **Stop and remove containers** 14s
- ▶  **Post actions/checkout@v2** 0s
- ▶  **Complete job** 0s
