





International Particle Physics Outreach Group (IPPOG) Report














Introduction to IPPOG

- Brief history: started as a network called the European Particle Physics Outreach Group (EPPOG) in 1997.
 - Sweden represented in the network through Fysikersamfundet.
 - Tightly connected to CERN in the beginning, changed name to IPPOG a couple of years ago to reach out worldwide.
 - Has expanded to cover much more than accelerator physics, in particular strong activities in cosmic ray (astroparticle) physics outreach.
- Transformed from a network into a formal collaboration three years ago, with membership fees.
 - Members can be countries, laboratories or experiments.
 - Fees are low (I kEuro/year), medium (3k) or large (5k), depending on the GDP and the size of the community.
 - This allows to go from ideas to action, to have the means to produce material and pay for critical organisational support.
- Meet twice a year for 2.5 day long, intense, meetings.
 - Our spring meeting was planned for Montenegro, but naturally had to be moved to a virtual meeting. Next (virtual) meeting next week, Dec 2-4.

- Three nations are close to finalising their membership signatures:
 - Bulgaria, Israel and South Africa.
 - Also DESY joined as an associate member to Germany during our last meeting (member but without voting rights).



Membership Fee

- While the membership fee is very small, it is a problem that the section for elementary particle- and astroparticle physics does not have any funds (nor possibilities to apply for funds).
 - Also all support for outreach and "third mission" has been stripped from the LHCk grant.
 - So far, has had to come up with ad hoc solutions every year to to find the money for the membership fee. Problem is solved for the next few years, but a steady source of funding needed.
 - Continue to raise this issue in communication with VR. It is not natural to depend on the universities to fund outreach and societal exchange related to national and international research infrastructures.
- Would it be useful to create an informal network for outreach in Sweden (similar to other countries), which could then coordinate both outreach activities and policy work? [coffee break discussion?]
 - Personally find it very important that funding for outreach and interaction with society (and our research infrastructures) is reinstated and it receives higher importance in evaluating our work.








IPPOG Annual Report
