#### **Dana Bernstein**

Dana Bernstein is an experienced media relations executive, with a proven track record in strategic communication and public relations for large international organizations. After **graduating with a BA in computer science** from IDC Herzliya in 2003, Ms. Bernstein worked for the United Nations' Department of Public Information as a public **information officer in the Outreach Division at the UN's NYC Headquarters**. In 2006 she moved to the **Office of the Spokesperson for the Secretary General of the UN**, where she worked during the term of two SGs, Kofi Annan and Ban Ki-Moon. Upon her return to Israel in 2008, Ms. Bernstein worked as the spokesperson and head of the **public relations department at IDC Herzliya**.

In 2012, Ms. Bernstein was appointed as **Head of Communications for the British Embassy in Israel**. In this capacity, she was responsible for communicating UK policy objectives to the Israeli media and public, generating a media profile for the UK and its Ambassador across multiple media channels, and promoting Embassy activities. For her excellent service, she was selected by the UK Foreign Office to participate in its prestigious Global Leadership Development Program.

Ms. Bernstein joined the **Weizmann Institute of Science as Spokesperson and Head of Communications** in September 2020. In this capacity, she also serves as the Head of the Department of Communications.
