Summary of the meeting

- 1. Mario Kadastik (NICPB) informs about **Estonia's accession to CERN**: on 19.06. Estonia became a CERN Associate Member State in pre-stage to full membership. The agreement has to be ratified by the Parliament in October 2020, followed by the full membership in 2021.
- 2. Status update on **Industry engagement**: Mario Kadastik (NICPB) on Estonia's ILO as she started duties in July 2020, separate meeting about CBG Industry activities will be organized in August 2020 in Estonia.
- 3. To obtain more information on Task Force organisation, industry engagement and other issues regarding cooperation with CERN it is planned by RTU to visit to Estonia in August 2020.
- 4. Toms Torims (RTU) on **Latvia's accession** to become an Associate member state in 2021: Task force was established in the June 2020 Council and will visit Latvia in September 2020.
- 5. The project proposal for the **State Research Programme** in High Energy Physics and Accelerator Technologies has been submitted in June 2020 the total available funding is a total of 900 000 EUR for two years; the main aim of the project is to build the research capacitiy in high-energy physics and accelerator technologies and to attract master and doctoral level students to these fields.
- 6. Mārcis Auziņš (UL) informs about possible new collaboration between UL and CERN in the **anti-proton decelerator's experiment(-s)**; in the field of atomic physics.

- 7. Kārlis Dreimanis (RTU) updates on the **CERN Baltic School:** as CERN is not operational until September 2020 and the lecturers could not travel abroad, it was collegially agreed that the School will be postponed to 28.09.-02.10.2020. Announcement will be updated, all registered students (15 in total) will be informed; current registration deadline of 10.07 is also to be re-evaluated.
- 8. Mārcis Auziņš (UL) on the progress of the **Study programme**: the study course mapping is on-going; the programme description is to be prepared by September 2020.
- 9. Toms Torims (RTU) on the CBG **membership in TIARA**: on 02.07. CBG has joined TIARA Committee as a member to maximise impact and visibility of the CBG via activities in R&D, particle accelerators and projects applications bringing political/financial support for the region.
- 10. It was agreed that the next **CBG General meeting** will be organised in Riga, in October 2020, as a 2 day event under the auspices of the University of Latvia. Precise dates to be agreed upon via doodle.
