## Opportunities for the WLCG collaboration in the EC FP7 Marie-Curie Programmes







- Marie-Curie Individual fellowships programme funds individual researchers to acquire new skills
  - Involves a host organisation (CERN), an experienced researcher (the applicant) and a supervisor (a member of the CERN personnel who will oversee the work of the researcher)
  - The programme funds the costs of the fellowship for between 12 and 24 months







- An individual fellow must be an Experienced Researcher
  - i) has at least 4 years of research experience (full-time equivalent) after obtaining the degree which would formally entitle them to embark on a doctorate; or
  - ii) is already in possession of a doctoral degree (PhD)
  - The researcher (any nationality) can be in Europe already and apply for an *Intra-European Fellowship*; or be outside Europe (any nationality) and apply for an *International Incoming Fellowship*

- The researcher submits an application directly to Brussels
  - Quoting CERN as the host institute and naming the supervisor
    - Must agree programme of work/training and supervisor with CERN before submission
  - Must explain how this fellowship will help develop their career and outline a training programme during stay at CERN
  - The maximum duration for an individual fellowship is 24 months
  - Someone who has already had a CERN Fellow contract for more than 12 months cannot apply because of our 36 month upper limit as CERN Fellow
  - The researcher cannot have spent more than 12 months in the previous 36 months at CERN by the submission deadline (17 August 2010).
  - Evaluation process takes at least 9 months (i.e. successful fellowship could start in summer 2011)







 Successful applications are of high quality so read carefully the material and address all the points
